

ISLAND PARK PUBLIC LIBRARY WIRELESS ACCESS POLICY

The Island Park Public Library offers free wireless access at the Library for Library patrons to use with their own laptops/portable devices. A patron's use of this service is governed by the [*Island Park Public Library's Internet Policy*](#).

As with most public wireless "hot spots," the Library's wireless connection is not secure. Information sent from or to a patron's portable device can be captured by anyone else with a wireless device and appropriate software. Virus protection, spyware protection, a personal firewall and other measures to protect the information on the patron's portable device is highly recommended and is the sole responsibility of the user. The Library is not responsible for any damage, theft or loss of any kind to a user's equipment, software, data files or other personal property brought into or used at the Library. Patrons should not leave laptops/portable devices unattended.

The wireless service is available during the hours that the Library is open.

In order to obtain access the user must accept the Library's Conditions for Use of the Island Park Library's Wireless Network and accept the Library's Internet Policy.

Printing from the user's portable device is not available. In order to print, work must be saved to a USB flash drive or emailed to the patron, then logged into a library workstation and then printed.

The Library cannot be responsible for any changes made to a computer's settings, nor does the staff provide technical assistance with the patron's equipment. If assistance is needed, the patrons may need to contact the hardware or software manufacturer.

Tampering with the Library systems or settings in any way, saving or download programs or files to the network is not allowed. Viewing of sexually graphic and/or explicit material, as prohibited by the Library Internet policy and by state and federal law is prohibited.

If a user does not comply with the rules for wireless access, their computer privileges may be revoked and they may be subject to suspension from the Library.
